Did you know the North Rapid Civic Association is a member of Ellsworth Federal Credit Union?

Did you know Ellsworth Federal Credit Union has a full-service branch office in downtown Rapid City?

What's this mean to you? Well, if you are a paid-up member of the North Rapid Civic Association, you can join the Ellsworth Federal Credit Union as an individual. This means you and members of your family can receive all the benefits of a credit union.

Interest rates on loans are generally lower at credit unions than at other lending institutions. There is a full range of checking and savings accounts, home mortgage loans, student loans, home and auto loans, and even signature loans. You can even get a VISA card there.

Ellsworth even has an Audio Response capability, called ART. And that service is free. With ART, you can dial the credit union computer from your home phone and transfer money from one account to another, such as savings to checking.
